
Grade Reports

Select Course Guide

Report cards with a combination of IB-MYP grades and MEXT (=Ministry of Education) grades for 7th-10th grade and MEXT grades for 11th-12th grades are issued at the end of each term/year. MYP grades ron a scale of 7 with 7 being the highest grade, and MEXT grades are on a scale of 5 with 5 being the highest. We do not weigh classes differently depending on the difficulty of classes. Therefore, the school does not release student rankings nor GPAs. 11th and 12th graders in the IB-DP programme are also issued 1-7 scale grades aligned with the DP as well as predicted scores in July, predicted grades in October of the DP 2nd year (12th grade). The final DP results will be issued from the IBO in January of the DP 2nd year (12th grade).
